TITLE?

Rationalisation of emollients

WHAT?

- Promote use of lower acquisition cost alternatives for emollients prescribed in high volume across WHCCG.
- Reduce use of aqueous cream.

WHY?

- There is currently high use of expensive products with no evidence for advantage over lower cost alternatives.
- Aqueous cream is no longer recommended due to the sodium lauryl sulfate (SLS) content but use of this product within WH CCG remains high.

WHO?

- All patients currently prescribed Aqueous cream, E45 cream, Diprobase cream, Doublebase gel, Epaderm ointment and Aveeno cream.
- Aveeno cream is subject to ACBS criteria:
 - Endogenous and exogenous eczema, xeroderma, ichthyosis and senile pruritus associated with dry skin.
 - A definite diagnosis for one of these conditions should be confirmed before switching patients to Zeroveen.
 - Where the patient does not have a condition that is covered by these criteria but still requires treatment with an emollient, an alternative lower cost product that does not contain oatmeal should be prescribed.
- Patients prescribed Cetraben cream, Epaderm cream and Diprobase ointment may also be considered for a switch to a similar product.

TIPS?

- ALL practice staff should be made aware of this switch as it is a topic that patients may choose
 to discuss with any of them. This includes GPs, practices nurses, healthcare assistants,
 prescription clerks, reception staff and also community teams working with the practice.
- Patients and healthcare professionals should be made aware of the MHRA alert¹ Safe use of emollient skin creams to treat dry skin conditions and its resources.

HOW?

- Search for all patients on the relevant products and switch to the alternative as shown below:
 - Aqueous cream to ZeroAQS
 - E45 cream to Zerocream
 - Diprobase cream to Epimax cream
 - o Epaderm ointment to Zeroderm ointment
 - Doublebase gel to Isomol gel
 - Aveeno cream to Zeroveen
- Each patient will need to be reviewed and switched individually.

SO WHAT?

• Achieve better value for money.
