Offer opportunistic vaccination to those who are unimmunised. Where patients do not have a clear history, the vaccination should be offered.

2

Use a variety of methods to invite patients to immunisation appointments i.e., text, letter, telephone call and invite eligible children at least three times.

3

Ensure the correct SNOMED Code is used.

4

Ensure CHIS is notified of all child (0-19) immunisations given in the Practice.

10

Identify and act to reduce local barriers to Vaccination (please refer to aide memoire).

Top 10 tips for GP practices to increase uptake of routine childhood immunisations

5

Immunisers should be aware of other countries vaccination schedules using resources such as the UK and international immunisation schedules comparison tool.

Have a dedicated phone line for patients to book immunisations or speak to a HCP.

8

Have enough appointments for all patient and have accessible appointments such as evening and weekends.

7

Ensure letters and resources are available in different languages and easy read format.

6

Have a DNA policy and contact parents/carers where children have missed vaccinations to discuss the importance of vaccination and address any concerns/hesitancy.
