Wessex LMCs Introduction

Many of you will have no doubt seen the "<u>Christmas message</u>" that came from Wes Streeting just before the holiday period. It is a response to calls from the BMA, LMCs, Practices and individual GPs for reassurance and clarity on funding for General Practice in the coming year.

There is a welcome acknowledgement and commitment to address our concerns and financial pressures. There is a commitment to bring back the family doctor, (I wasn't aware that we had gone away!), and increase the share of NHS funding that is allocated to General Practice with approximately 4.8% real terms growth. I remain to be convinced that this is indeed additional investment and not simply funding that will be absorbed by the increased employers NI contribution and national living wage increase.

Recently qualified GPs employed under the ARRS scheme this year will continue to be supported through the scheme in the coming year but there is no guarantee of longer term funding commitment.

We await the detail of what reform will be required in return for the investment. It is clear that disease prevention, continuity of care and cutting bureaucracy are government priorities so let's hope actions speak louder than words when the detail is released.

It is positive to see that there is a commitment for close and constructive consultation with GPC England around the detail of proposed changes and the future GMS contract. The Government has been informed that the outcome of these discussions will need to be ready to be shared with the profession ahead of a special conference of LMCs on 19th March 2025. This will provide representatives of the profession from across England the opportunity to review and consider the Government's proposals in detail.

I do see some hope for us in this message and a feeling that we are finally being listened to and prioritised by Government.

Winter Pressures

Take a read of the <u>joint letter</u> on winter pressures from NHS England (NHSE), the Care Quality Commission (CQC), the General Medical Council (GMC) and the Nursing and Midwifery Council (NMC).

Updates to Medical Certificates of Cause of Death Guidance

DHSC have updated their <u>guidance for medical practitioners completing medical certificates of cause of death</u> (MCCD) with regards to implantable medical devices and medical practitioner qualifications. Medical practitioners are asked to adhere to the guidance to make sure death certification and registration are processed swiftly.

GP practices are asked to check they have enough MCCDs to last until the end of April 2025. <u>Guidance</u> is available on ordering and retaining MCCDs and counterfoils, and what to do with those in use before 9th September 2024.

Pharmacy First GP Referral Pathway Information

Information is available for GP practices on <u>referring patients to Pharmacy First for lower acuity minor illnesses</u> <u>and clinical pathway consultations</u>. The webpage explains how the referral pathway works and how to implement it in primary care networks (PCNs) and practices.
